

some, or all of the discussions.


September 4, 2019


October 2, 2019

An award-winning scientist melds memoir and natural history while describing her study of plants. (nonfiction, 2016)

***The Heart is a Lonely Hunter*
by Carson McCullers**

Set in a Georgia mill town in the 1930s, this haunting story gives voice to the rejected, the forgotten, and the mistreated as well as to its heroine's personal search for beauty. (fiction, 1940)


December 4, 2019

The devastating 1986 fire in the Los Angeles Public Library is at the center of the author's wide-ranging coverage of the evolution of libraries and of the colorful characters working in and using libraries. (nonfiction, 2018)

by Fredrick Backman**

When seven-year-old Elsa's grandmother dies, she leaves several letters of apology which the girl is to personally deliver to their assorted recipients. (fiction, 2015)

***The Feather Thief: Beauty, Obsession, and the Natural History Heist of the Century*
by Kirk Wallace Johnson**

This gripping story of a bizarre crime and of the author's relentless pursuit of justice is also a fascinating exploration of obsession and man's destructive instinct to harvest the beauty of nature. (nonfiction, 2018)

***The Nest*
by Cynthia D'Aprix Sweeney**

One brother's car accident has endangered the joint trust fund that four adult siblings, each counting on the money to solve self-inflicted problems, are months away from receiving. (fiction, 2016)

***The Book of Ages: The Life and Opinions of Jane Franklin*
by Jill Lepore**

Jane Franklin and her older brother Benjamin exchange letters throughout their lives, providing two distinct pictures of early America. (nonfiction, 2013)


May 6, 2020

Two stories told in alternating chapters take place roughly 150 years apart on the same residential lot in Vineland, New Jersey. (fiction, 2018)

by Patrick Radden Keefe**

The author uses the 1972 kidnapping of a mother of ten as a starting point for this tale of a society wracked by a violent guerrilla war. (nonfiction, 2019)
