Message from the Director


The Marcellus Free Library will have a proposition on the May 16, 2017 School District budget ballot. Although we serve residents of the Marcellus Central School District, The Marcellus Free Library is a separate entity from the school district. New York State statute allows Free Association libraries like Marcellus to place a proposition on the school district ballot to levy a tax to support the library. The proposition will read as follows:


Shall the annual appropriation for the Marcellus Free Library be increased from its current level of \$503,076 per year to \$513,138 per year?

The library is requesting an increase of \$10,062 or 2%. For tax payers, this will amount to an increase of about \$1 per \$100,000 of assessed property value. This increase will allow the library to maintain its current hours of operation and improve upon its level of service to the community.

The library's estimated income for 2017 from fundraising, fines, grants and other sources is \$142,068. These funds, plus the \$513,138 budget proposition represent the total budget of \$655,206. The MFL staff and Board of Trustees recognize the spirit and generosity of the Marcellus community and thank you for your continued support. ***If you have any questions please feel free to contact me or attend our May 4 Library Board of Trustees meeting.***
