The Marcellus Free Library will have a proposition on the May 16, 2023 School District budget ballot. The library is not a taxing authority, but New York State Education Law allows Free Association libraries like MFL to place a proposition on the school district ballot to levy a tax to support the library. The proposition will read as follows:

Shall the annual appropriation for the Marcellus Free Library be increased from its current level of \$544,547 per year to \$563,600 per year?

If approved, property owners can expect an increase of approximately \$1.95 per \$100,000 of assessed property value, assuming no change in assessments and equalization rates. This increase will help maintain the facility, services, programs, and schedule of the library.
